Instructional reading level charts provide a general guideline for grade-level instructional reading expectations and a ladder of progress through each grade level. They can and should be adjusted according to your school/district's expectations.

To track each student's progress across a given school year:

- Administer the beginning-of-year Leveled Reading Assessment (LRA) or other recommended assessment to obtain the highest instructional reading level. Enter the instructional reading level on the chart.
- Use ongoing progress monitoring assessments or a student's current instructional level to track progress.
- Administer the Leveled Reading Assessment (LRA) for the midyear and end-of-year assessment. Enter the instructional level on the chart. Use ongoing progress monitoring tools to track progress between assessments.
- Compare your student's assessment data with grade-level expectations. If your student is not meeting those expectations, consider implementing additional guided reading lessons.
